Project #2:

Color Block Cushion Cover

Level: Intermediate





You'll be working with three beautiful colors, creating a striped effect. The cover consists of a decorative front panel and a back panel that allows for easy insertion and removal of the cushion. The overlap design of the back ensures a snug fit without the need for buttons or zippers.

The best part is that you can mix and match colors to fit your style or mood. Feeling bold? Go for bright contrasts. Want something calming? Try soft, similar shades.

Materials:

- · 50g of Merino Majesty in pink (color 14393), 50g of Merino Majesty in cream (color 978), 50g of Merino Majesty in blue (color 14607)
- · US size 8 (5 mm) hook (from your previous boxes)
- · Scissors
- · Sewing needle

Stitches and abbreviations used:

- · Ch chain
- · St(s) stitch(es)
- · SI-st slip stitch
- · Sc single crochet

Gauge:

14 sts and 7 rows of double crochet in 4"

- · Dc double crochet
- · BLO back loop only
- · FLO front loop only
- · Rep repeat

Measurements:

12 ½" x 12 ½"

Front

With color 14393, ch45.

Row 1

Starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, 44sc. (Image 1)

Row 2

Ch3 (counts as 1st dc throughout) and turn the work, skip st at base of chain and 43dc. (Images 2, 3)

Rows 3-9

Rep row 2. (Make sure not to miss the last ch3 of the row below as the last st you work into).


In the last st of row 9, change to color 978 and cut color 14393. (Image 4)


Row 10

Ch3 and turn the work, dc BLO in each st. (Images 5-8)

Row 11

Ch3 and turn the work, dc FLO in each st. (Images 9, 10)





Rows 12-17

Rep rows 10 & 11 three more times.

In the last st of row 17, change to color 14607 and cut color 14393. (Image 11)

Row 18

Ch3 and turn the work, dc BLO in each st. (Image 12)

Rows 19-24

Ch3 and turn the work, 43dc.

Fasten off the yarn. The front of the cushion cover is finished. (Image 13)

Back

With color 14393, ch45.

Row 1

Starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, 44sc.

Rows 2-9

Ch3 (counts as 1st dc throughout), 43dc.

Fasten off the yarn at the end of row 9, leaving a long tail for sewing up. (Image 14)

With color 14607, ch45.

Row 1

Starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, 44sc.

Rows 2-9

Ch3 (counts as 1st dc throughout), 43dc.

In the last st of row 9, change to color 978. Keep a long tail of color 14607 and approx. 8 inch tail of color 978 for sewing up. (Images 15, 16)

Rows 10-16

Ch3, 43dc.

Fasten off the yarn at the end of row 16, keeping approx. 8 inches tail for sewing up. (Images 17, 18)









Sewing together

When sewing up, use the yarn tails of the matching colors. Align the color 14393 sections of the front and back so that the last row of the back piece will be sewn to the first color 978 row of the front piece. With the wrong sides together, sew the edges of the front and back together around all edges of the color 14393 section.

Align the color 14607 sections of the front and back so that the last color 14607 row of the back piece will be sewn to the last color 978 row of the front piece. Sew the edges of the front and back together around all edges of the color 14607 section.

Finally, sew the front and back together along the color 978 edges. The last row of the back pieces will overlap; sandwich the color 14393 section between the color 978 edges and finish sewing together. (Images 19-22)

Using color 978, sI-st all around the cushion cover, working 3 sI-st in the corners. (Images 23-25)

Your cushion cover is ready!
