Project #1:

Sailor's Knot Headband

Crochet level: Beginner





Learn a new crochet technique while crafting a cozy and stylish headband. This pattern guides you through creating a sailor's knot detail and a reversible design, resulting in a versatile accessory you'll love wearing.

Materials:

- · Woodland Whisper in Color 19 50 g.
- · 5 mm crochet hook
- · Sewing needle

Stitches and abbreviations used:

- · St stitch
- · Ch chain
- · Dc double crochet
- · SI-st slip stitch

Measurements:

 Measured 25 inches in length, and when assembled, the headband circumference is 20.5 inches.

Headband pieces (make 2)


Round 1

Ch92, 2dc into 3rd ch from hook, dc to the last st, 4dc into this st.

Turn the work to continue working into the other side of the chain. Dc to last st, 2dc into this st. SI-st to first stitch to join. (Images 1, 2, 3)








Round 2


Continue to work around rather than turning. Ch2, *2dc in 1st st (the same that you just sl-st into), dc to last st (the second of the 4dc from the previous round), 2dc into this st, Repeat from * to the last st, 2dc in this st. Sl-st to the first st to join. (Images 4, 5, 6)




Sailor's knot

Position the headband pieces as shown in the picture. (Image 7)

Take the right end of the strap laid across the top and slide it under the loop of the other piece.



Next, take the left end and slide it underneath the right end and over the top of the looped strap. (images 8, 9)



Take one end of the looped strap, pull it out from its starting position, and slide it under the other strap, as pictured. (Images 10, 11)




Pull evenly on all ends to close up the knot. You may find it easier to pull one side and then the other, but make sure the knot is even and centered with the same length of straps on either side. (Images 12, 13)



Sew the sides of the straps ends together.

Flip the piece over and sew the two short ends together. (Image 14, 15)



Weave in all ends.

And you are done!
