

Project #1: Sofa Sidekick

Knitting level: Beginner



This vibrant knit case is perfect for holding your remote controls and other small items. It's easy to make and great for adding a splash of color to your sofa. It keeps everything you need within arm's reach.

You can access your digital pattern with a **quick scan of the QR code!**



Materials:

- US size 7 (4.5 mm) circular needles (from your previous boxes)
- 30 grams of Blossom Wool in a light blue color (7)
- 30 grams of Blossom Wool in a dark blue color (11)
- 40 grams of Blossom Wool in an orange color (15)
- Scissors
- Sewing needle

Terms and abbreviations used:

- K – knit
- P – purl

Note: Feel free to mix and match the colors in any combination you prefer.

The base

Cast on 60 sts. Start with orange (color 15).

Row 1

K60

Row 2

P60

Row 3

k1, p1

Repeat *this pattern till the end of the row.

Row 4

k1, p1

Repeat *this pattern till the end of the row.

Row 5

P1, *k1, p1*

Repeat *this pattern till the end of the row, k last st.

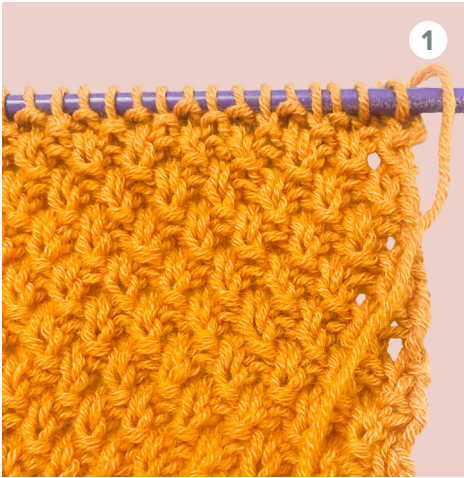
Row 6

P1, *k1, p1*

Repeat *this pattern till the end of the row, k last st.

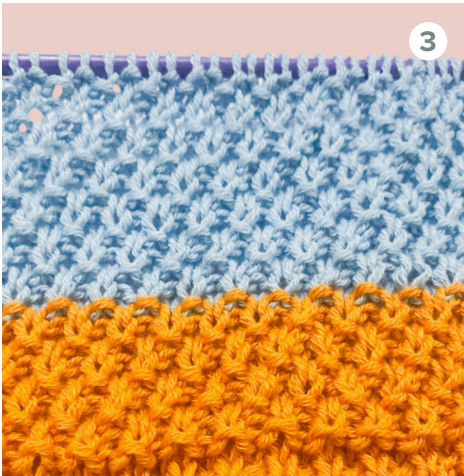
Repeat rows 3-6 till the project reaches 6-7 inches. (image 1)

When the project reaches 6-7 inches, make a purl row - p60 (we will need this purl row to fold the pocket). (image 2)



Continue repeating rows 3-6 for 2 more inches and then change to a light blue (color 7).

Start a new row with a light blue (color 7). Repeat rows 3-6 till the knitting part of a light blue (color 7) measures 10 inches. (images 3, 4)



Change to a dark blue (color 11) and start a new row with it. Repeat rows 3-6 until the knitting part of a dark blue (color 11) measures 5 inches.

Cast off the sts. Weave in loose ends.

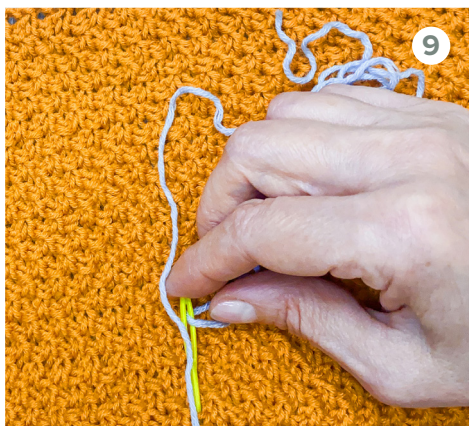
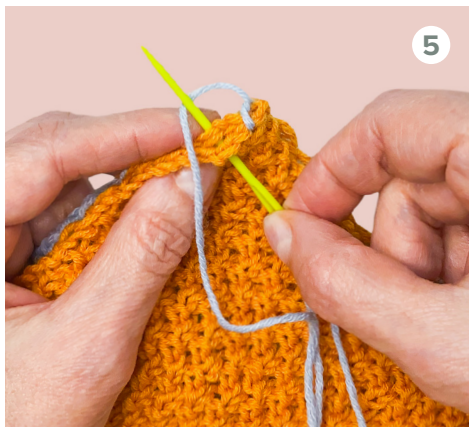
The pocket

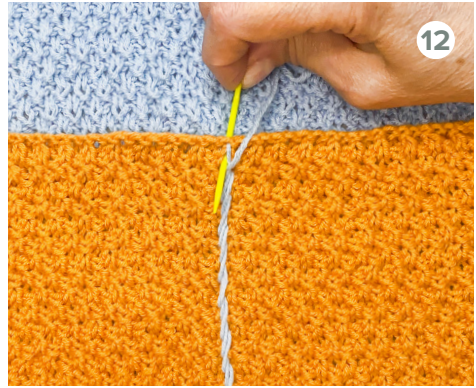
Step 1

Fold the project on the *p60 row.

Step 2

Sew the edges of the project together. Then, sew the middle part of the pocket to the base to form two pockets. (images 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12)





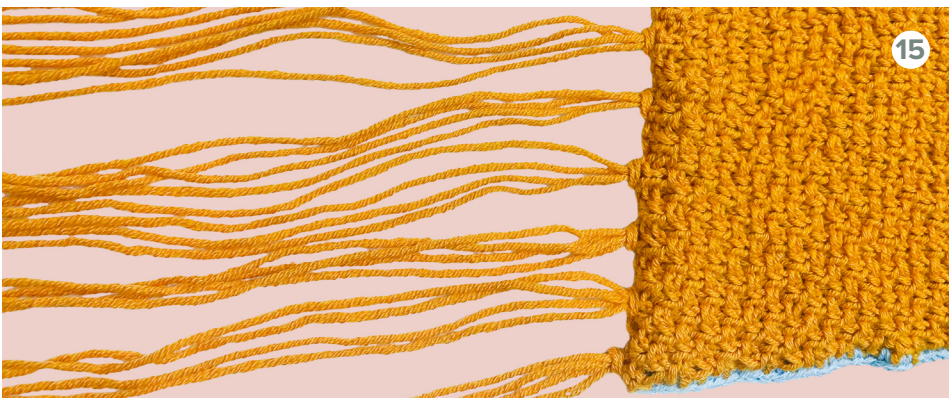
The fringes

Step 1

Cut the yarn into 28" long pieces (32 pieces).

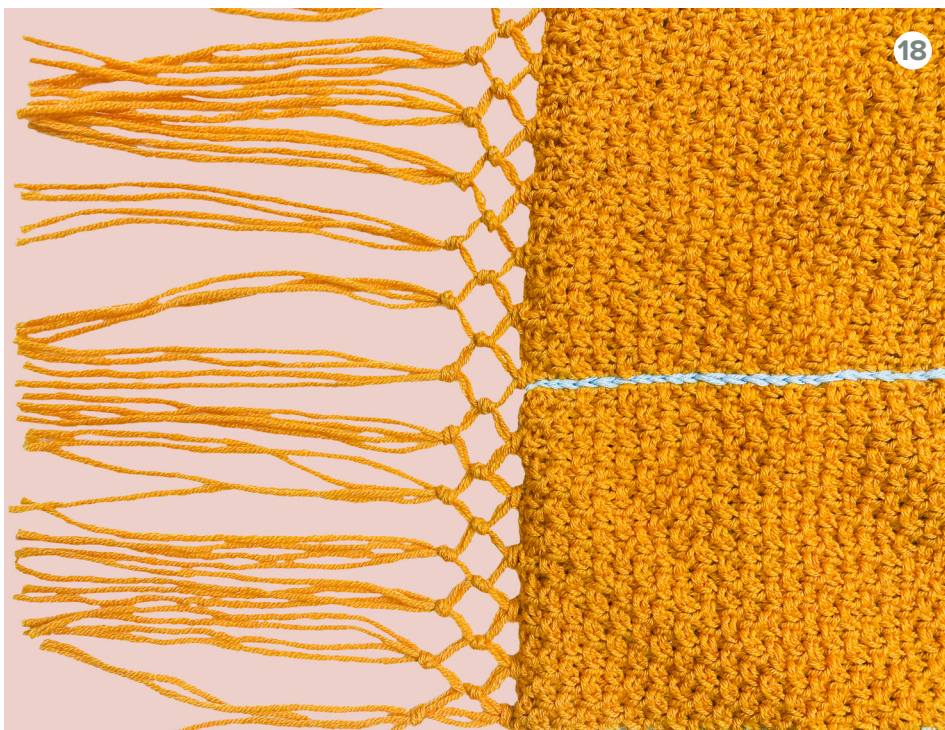
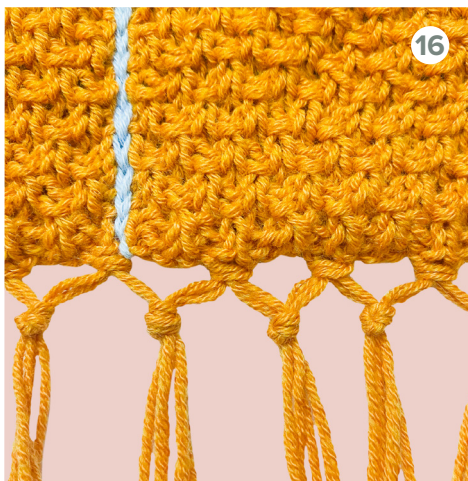
Step 2

Attach it to the lower edge of the pocket, as shown in the photo, using a crochet hook, knitting needle, or sewing needle. (images 13, 14, 15)



Step 3

Take two threads from each fringe and make knots as shown in the photos below. (images 16, 17, 18)
